



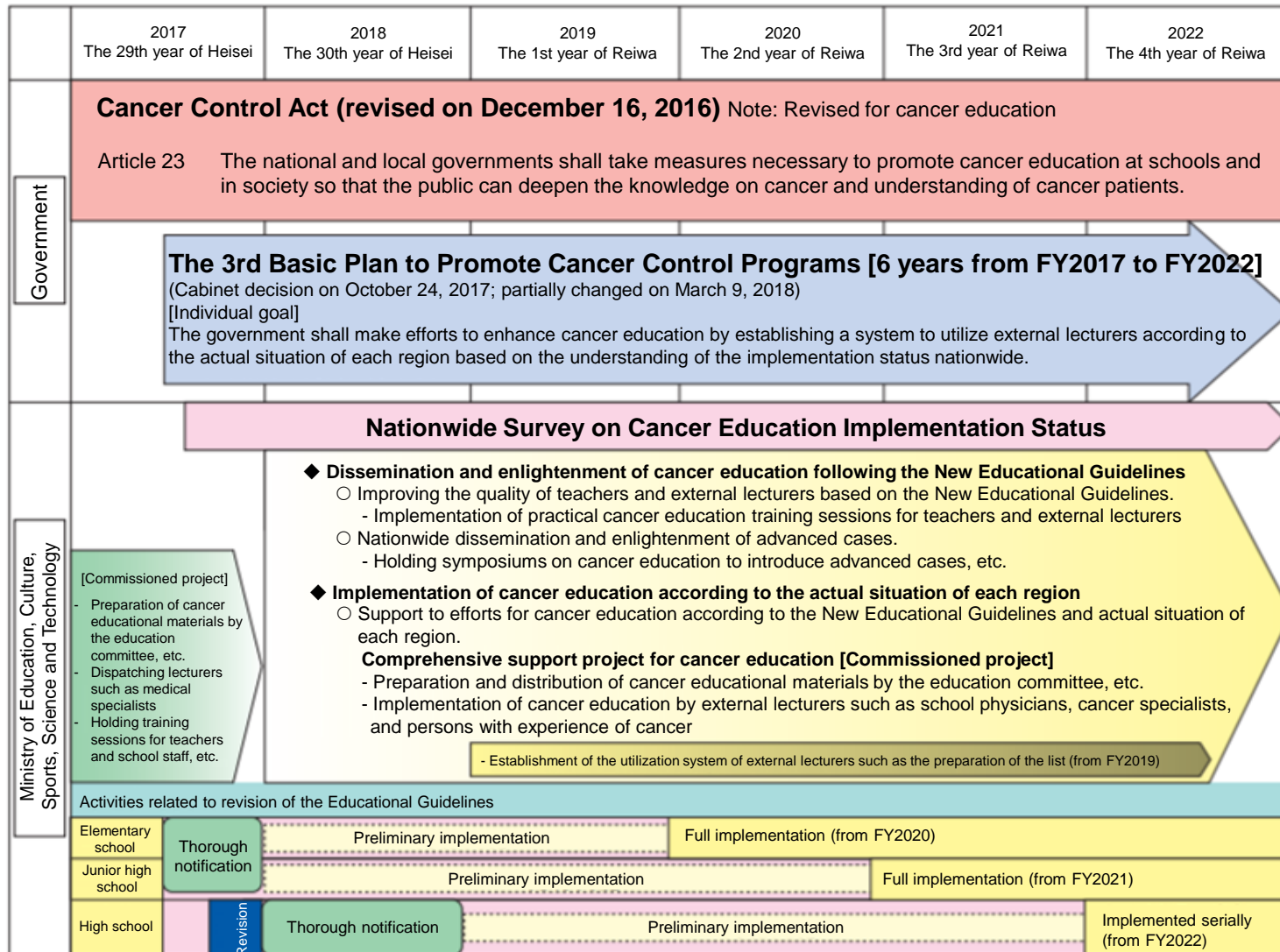

- At present, it is estimated that approximately 1 in 2 Japanese people will get "cancer" in their lifetime.¹⁾
- Based on such situation, the Educational Guidelines were revised to clearly state "Cancer Education", implementing the cancer education classes at elementary, junior high, and high schools since FY2020 (see the next page).²⁾
- Given the high specialty of cancer, the participation and cooperation of external lecturers, including medical professionals, are expected for the implementation of cancer education.³⁾
- Meanwhile, only 8.4% of schools provided "cancer education utilizing external lecturers" (approximately 40% of them were medical doctors) in FY2021 (total number of responding schools: 36,194).⁴⁾

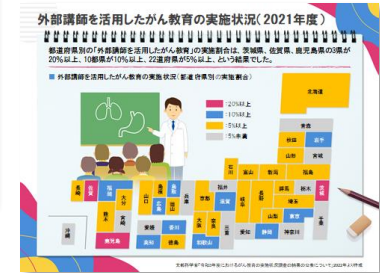

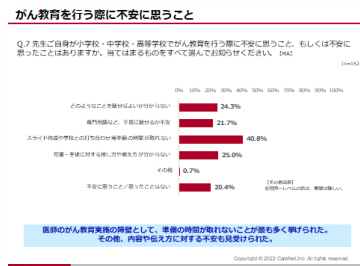
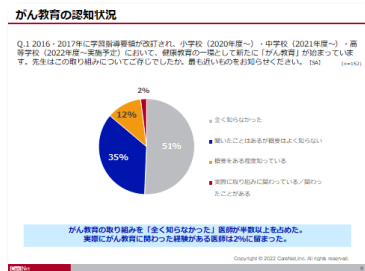
